





















Introduction

Our Year 2022-24 in Review Seminars, Workshops and Conferences

We hosted dozens of series of thought-provoking seminars, conclaves and conferences to discuss critical issues facing our nation and the world:

1) Sustaining India's Climate and Development: The Centre for Narendra Modi Studies hosted a seminar titled "Sustaining India's Climate and Development" to address the post-pandemic era's challenges. The seminar, commemorating Chandrashekhar Jayanti, was graced by the Hon'ble Shri Arif Mohammad Khan, Governor of Kerala. The seminar drew over 300 participants, including policymakers, environmental experts, and academicians, who engaged in discussions aimed at propelling India towards sustainable growth.



- 2) **Day of Public Service and Nation Building:** The Centre for Narendra Modi Studies organised a seminar titled the "Day of Public Service and Nation Building" on the 72nd birthday of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The chief guest of the seminar was Shri Virendra Singh, Member of Parliament from Ballia. The seminar saw the participation of approximately 250 attendees, comprising government officials, public servants, and representatives from non-governmental organizations, who deliberated on strategies to fortify nation-building efforts.
- 3) G-20 Towards a Sustainable Habitat: The "G-20 Towards a Sustainable Habitat" conference was organised by Centre for Narendra Modi Studies. The conference detailed about the necessity of clean and safe water. Shri C P Radhakrishnan, Hon'ble Governor of Jharkhand, presided as the chief guest. The conference attracted over 300+ delegates, including environmentalists, and industry leaders, who convened to discuss sustainable solutions for global habitat challenges.



- 4) Role of Women in Emerging Societies: A seminar on the "Role of Women in Emerging Societies" was conducted to explore the transformative role of women in societal development. The seminar witnessed the participation of around 280 individuals, featuring a diverse group of women leaders, social activists, and scholars who highlighted the contributions and challenges of women in shaping emerging societies.
- 5) **New India and Narendra Modi:** The Centre for Narendra Modi Studies organised a conference on "New India and Narendra Modi" which was led by Acharya Mahamandaleshwar Swami Shri Kailashanand Giri Ji Maharaj as the chief guest. The conference was attended by over 270 people. The conference focused on the philosophical and cultural underpinnings of the vision for a New India, as inspired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.
- 6) **Remembering MAA:** The one who shaped the idea of New India: The commemorative seminar "Remembering MAA: The one who shaped the idea of New India" paid homage to Heeraben Modi, the mother of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The seminar was held on 30th December 2023 and drew the participation of 210 attendees, including historians, political analysts, and cultural figures.



7) Book Release Ceremony: 'Constitutional Journey: An Overview from 2014-2024'

Chief Guest: Arjun Ram Meghwal- Union Minister of Law and Justice



The Union Minister of Law and Justice, Shri Arjun Ram Meghwal, graced the book release ceremony at the Constitution Club of India on May 12. The ceremony, organized by the Centre for Narendra Modi Studies (CNMS) featured the release of 'Constitutional Journey: An Overview from 2014-2024, authored by Rishi Raj Singh and Prince Shukla.

The event was presided over by Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, the veteran journalist and President of the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA).

While addressing the gathering, the Union Minister of Law and Justice, Shri Arjun Ram Meghwal shed light on the opaque insertion of Article 35-A into the Constitution, termed it a "constitutional fraud." He said that the Parliament was kept in the dark about the presidential order related to Article 35-A. He pointed out that the Parliament was not informed about the presidential order, and no formal amendment was made to the Constitution regarding this article.

The Union Minister of Law and Justice also commended the authors for their detailed examination of Article 35-A in their book "Constitutional Journey: An Overview from 2014-2024."











He remarked on the manner of its inclusion in the Constitution, described it as a backdoor entry. He praised the young authors for their enlightening work, stating that they have played a pivotal role in awakening the public's understanding through their book.

During the book release ceremony Shri Hari Borikar, Organizational Secretary of the A.B.A.P expressed his admiration for the scholarly work and its contribution to the nation's intellectual heritage. He commended the young authors for their dedication and the depth of their research. He also emphasized the importance of the book 'Constitutional Journey: An Overview from 2014-2024' as a cornerstone in understanding the nuances of India's constitutional developments. He expressed hope that the book would inspire future scholars and practitioners.

Senior Advocate of the Supreme Court, Shri Govind Goyal, expressed his profound admiration for the book 'Constitutional Journey: An Overview from 2014-2024' at the book release ceremony. He said that the authors have brilliantly authored the book and is indeed a proud moment for all of us in the legal profession to witness the emergence of such a significant contribution to legal literature. He also stated that this book is a source of inspiration for aspiring legal minds and a valuable resource for seasoned practitioners.

Shri Manan Mishra, Chairman of the Bar Council of India expressed the book's profound impact during the ceremony. He said that such scholarly works are are the pillars upon which the




"Should there be any such meritorious work, we pledge to publish it without cost, provided it serves the national interest," he said.

























8) "Reflecting on India's Dark Days" - Commemorated 49th Anniversary of Emergency on June 26

Chief Guest: Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan



Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan graces Conclave on 49 Anniversary Emergency organised by Centre for Narendra Modi Studies

"Those who claim to safeguard the Constitution and parade it around have no right to touch it after what they did with the Constitution in 1975," said Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Union Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development, as he graced the conclave titled "Reflecting on India's Dark Days," organised by the Centre for Narendra Modi Studies (NaMo Kendra- CNMS) at the India International Center, New Delhi, to commemorate the 49th anniversary of the Emergency.

In his address, Chouhan highlighted the resilience of Indian democracy and the valuable lessons learned from this dark chapter in history. "Dictatorship runs in Congress' DNA. They wanted autocracy. Three judges were demoted and one judge was promoted to pass their (Congress') rulings. The elections were cancelled and Indira Gandhi ji won through the misuse of government and the administration," Chouhan said.

While sharing his personal experiences, he added, "During the Emergency, I was also arrested and sent to jail and beaten with sticks. I was only 17 years old at that time. I was beaten ruthlessly while in custody, and I still feel the effects of that torture. The physical and emotional scars from that period remain with me to this day." He also recounted a deeply personal loss,





saying, "One of the most painful memories for me is that when my grandmother died, she couldn't see me because I was imprisoned during the Emergency."

"It was the height of atrocities those days. The entire country was turned into a jail," he said.

The imposition of Emergency by the then Congress government was "indeed a dark chapter" in the country's history, Chouhan said while addressing a conclave organised by Centre for Narendra Modi Studies to deliberate on the period between 1975 and 1977.

The then Congress government-imposed Emergency, "ripping the Constitution to shreds", to hold on to power after then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's election was set aside by the Allahabad High Court, the Union Agriculture Minister said.

"Indira Gandhi had won the election by misusing power. But she didn't quit and instead imposed Emergency. The Constitution was ripped to shreds. All fundamental rights were suspended. Provisions under the Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA) were made more draconian," he said.

Chouhan recalled how people were put in jails across the country during the Emergency period for protesting against the government and slammed the Congress, alleging, "All these things they did just to hold on to power. Dictatorship is in the DNA of the Congress."

"Today they talk about the Constitution but they do not have the right to even touch the



Constitution for what they did (during Emergency)," he added.

"During the Emergency, Indira Gandhi committed inhuman atrocities on the people, who were assaulted and electrocuted. Nobody had imagined that in independent India, people would be tortured in such a way. June 25 was the darkest day in the history of India's democracy. Even 16-17-year-old kids were put behind bars. Congress is working with the same mindset even today," he recalled.

"When I was released from jail and started working for the BJP, I rented a bicycle and travelled from one village to another, delivered lectures to gatherings of people without a microphone," recounted Shivraj Singh Chouhan. "Initially, we were afraid, but gradually, our fear diminished. We had no money to contest elections, so we appealed to the people for support."

"The people supported us wholeheartedly. With their help, we managed to rent a jeep and continue our campaign in those challenging times," he said.

The conclave began with a tribute to Jayaprakash Narayan, followed by inaugural remarks



from Professor Jasim Mohammad, Chairman of the Centre for Narendra Modi Studies who emphasized the necessity of educating the youth about the Emergency and its long-term effects on the nation.

"Just to cling to power, the Congress Government during the Emergency ignored every democratic principle and turned the nation into a jail. Anyone who disagreed with them was tortured and harassed. Socially regressive policies were used to target the weakest sections of society. These dark days showed how power-hungry leaders could abuse their authority and harm the people. It's important for everyone especially youth of India to remember this period and learn from it to protect our democracy. We must ensure such misuse of power never happens again, and continue to stand up for the rights and freedoms of every citizen," he said

Professor Jasim Mohammad informed that the Centre for Narendra Modi Studies will continue to organize conferences, workshops, seminars, and symposiums on the theme "Dark Emergency" throughout 2024-2025 in schools, colleges, and universities.

"The aim to conduct such conferences in educational institutes is to address the curiosity and questions of the youth of India who want to know more about the Emergency and its impact on the nation. Many young people wonder whether the Emergency was justified and necessary, and what lessons can be learned from it," he said

He said that centre for Narendra Modi studies extensive programs in educational institutes will provide the youth an opportunity to hear from the experts and the eyewitnesses, and to engage in a dialogue with them. The long will also showcase the stories of courage and resilience of the ordinary citizens, who fought for their rights and dignity during the Emergency.

Guest of Honour Jatinder Kumar from the USA, who played a significant role abroad in conveying the plight of the Indian people to world leaders during the Emergency and who strongly organised campaigns against the Emergency delivered an impactful address. "During the Emergency, RSS members worked tirelessly to highlight the trauma and suffering faced by the people of India, informed other country leaders about the atrocities being committed by the Indira Gandhi Government," he said. Jatinder Kumar emphasized, "RSS is the organization that saved democracy in India. They fought relentlessly for democratic values and stood firmly against the Emergency,".

"After the imposition of Emergency in June, 1975, I along with some other friends in the USA founded Indians for Democracy (IFD). In the United States and U.K. frequent marches and demonstrations were held in front of the Indian Embassy and Consulates. We also confronted Indian government leaders and officials about the excessive repression caused by the Indian government and countered the propaganda by the Indian missions abroad that in India there was not much opposition to the Emergency," he recalled.

"At that time, I had an Indian passport, but it was cancelled, and arrest warrants were issued against me due to our activities against the Emergency," he said.

"In the UK, Dr. Swamy and RSS workers founded Friends of India Society International (FISI). Then he came to the USA where we also started a FISI Chapter. He was FISI's first President and I was the second President. Soon we also had FISI Chapters in Canada, Germany, Holland, Japan, Hong Kong and Kenya where FISI carried out a strong campaign against Mrs. Gandhi's dictatorship. Whenever any Indian government official would visit any country and try to defend the Emergency, we would make them very uncomfortable and they would go back without any success. There is no doubt that the RSS movement in India and abroad had exerted a lot of pressure on the Indian Government," he said, adding that, "As a part of our campaign against Emergency, we used to meet U.S. Congressmen and Senators to brief them about the excessive repressions of Indians' civil rights by the Indian government,"

Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, in his presidential address, stated, "Imposing the Emergency was a murder of democracy and it was completely unnecessary. The actions taken during that period were unjustifiable." He urged people to pursue legal action against the Indira Gandhi family for their actions during that dark period, stating, "In today's times, people should file cases against the

Indira Gandhi family in the Supreme Court for what they did during the Emergency period."

Ram Bahadur Rai also quoted K Vikram Rao who recalled his jail days, "Today some incidents of 50 years ago come to mind. Especially the one in Baroda jail. A reporter asked me during my court appearance that which thing I remember and which I miss. I replied that I cannot hear the telephone ring in the jail, which hurts me a lot. I also do not get newspapers. But this shortcoming gradually disappeared when a young man used to deliver a bundle of newspapers to Baroda jail every day and the jailer sahab would become kind. Later I came to know that this agile young man was a volunteer named Narendra Damodar Das Modi,".

The conclave also featured a presentation of books and mementos to the esteemed guests, acknowledging their valuable contributions to the discourse on the Emergency.

Other distinguished guests of honour at the conclave including Prof. Raj Kumar Bhatia, former President of ABVP in 1975, who shared his experiences of student activism during the Emergency, emphasizing the role of youth in defending democracy. He emphasized the resilience and bravery shown by the people of India during that period. "The courage and determination of the youth were truly inspiring. We faced arrests, beatings, and unimaginable hardships, but we stood firm in our belief that democracy must prevail."






















9) How PM Narendra Modi Strengthened India's Relations with the Global World



He is also holding the additional charge of Governor of Telangana & Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry since 20 March 2024, after the resignation of Tamilisai Soundararajan. He was a member of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and was elected to the Lok Sabha from Coimbatore twice.[3] He was also the former state president of the BJP for Tamil Nadu.

Veteran Journalist Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, Padmashri, President IGNCA

Ram Bahadur Rai is a senior Hindi journalist. He is Former news editor of Hindi daily Jansatta. He has published and authored and edited several of books. He is known for some impressive biographies, written in Hindi, namely Shashwat Vidrohi Rajneta based on life and acts of Gandhian socialist Acharya J. B. Kripalani, Rahvari ke Sawal on Chandrashekhar and Manjil se Jyada Safar on V P Singh. He was a close associate of the Indian freedom fighter and political leader Jayaprakash Narayan and was also part of a Steering Committee of JP Movement.

Acharya Mahamandaleshwar Swami Shri Kailashanand Giri Ji Maharaj

Professor Jagdish Mukhi


Prof. Jagdish Mukhi is a prominent politician who served as the 28th Governor of Assam from 2017 to 2023 and the Governor of Nagaland (Additional Charge) from 2021 to 2023 and the Governor of Mizoram on 2019.[1][2] He is a member of the Bharatiya Janata Party and the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh.[3] Mukhi served as the 13th Lieutenant Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands from 2016 to 2017, Minister of Finance, Planning, Excise and Taxation and Higher Education, Government of Delhi in the Swaraj ministry from 1998 to 1998 representing Janakpuri Assembly constituency in the Delhi Legislative Assembly from 1993 to 2015.

However, the Centre for Narendra Modi Studies is in the process of establishing MoUs with Central Agricultural University, Imphal and other central universities across Bharat.




